Indians are the highest-earning migrant group in America, with a median household **income** of almost \$150,000 per year. That is double the national average and well ahead of Chinese migrants





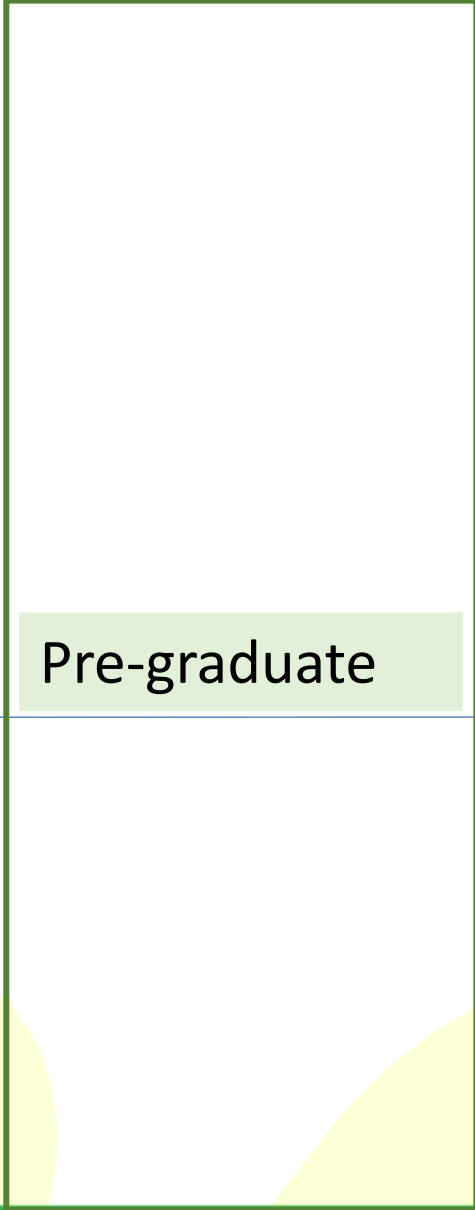
Adobe, Alphabet, Google's corporate parent, IBM and Microsoft are all led by people of Indian descent

We welcome applications from external stakeholders to use datasets from previous ESCP audits to help make full use and maximize potential of data.

Data sharing agreements between the University of Birmingham (where data is hosted on BISTC REDCap server) and the recipient of the data will be mandatory.

Applications for use of data should be brought forward by a current [Committee member](#) to be reviewed by the Cohort Studies Committee or subcommittee. It is mandatory that a current Cohort studies committee member should be involved in any project involving third parties.

Any publications resulting from the use of ESCP data will be published under the name "*ESCP Collaborating Group*" with those who contributed to previous data cited as co-authors.
